LEAVE A LEGACY

The following guidelines are available to assist you and your attorney, accountant or financial planner.

Think about the values that have been important in your life. Who instilled these values in you? Do you want to ensure those same values are passed along to others?

Charitable gift planning ensures that The First Tee can continue to impact the next generation of young people by providing educational programs that build character, instill life-enhancing values and promote healthy choices through the game of golf.

CHARITABLE BEQUESTS

A charitable bequest—a gift in your will—is either a percentage of your estate or a stated dollar amount designated to The First Tee. Many people discover that a bequest is a satisfying way for their legacy to impact future generations to come.

The First Tee will accept a charitable bequest in a will or testamentary trust. In addition to the traditional bequest designations, you may prefer to gift a percentage of the "residue" or what remains after paying all inheritances, debts and costs. Finally, there are special arrangements that allow you to make a gift that can provide income to your family and later be used by The First Tee to continue to make a difference in the lives of young people.

BENEFICIARY DESIGNATIONS

Beneficiary designations are an opportunity for individuals to name The First Tee as the beneficiary of funds from an irrevocable trust, life insurance policy, 401k or other retirement plan.

CHARITABLE REMAINDER TRUSTS

A Charitable Remainder Trust is a legal instrument into which you transfer irrevocably the ownership of assets such as securities or real estate. In return, you receive an immediate charitable income tax deduction and the right to receive an income. The income payments may be made to you (and/or one or more loved ones) for life, or a limited number of years.

When the trust ends, the property remaining in the trust (the charitable remainder) passes to The First Tee to be used to benefit the next generation of young people.

The First Tee will accept designation as a remainder beneficiary of a Charitable Remainder Trust. The First Tee is not in a position to serve as Trustee.

CHARITABLE LEAD TRUSTS

A Charitable Lead Trust is a legal instrument into which you transfer irrevocably the ownership of cash or other assets such as securities. The First Tee will receive income payments and you will receive a charitable income tax deduction for the amount of this gift. After a fixed term of years, the trust assets are paid to the donor or donor's beneficiaries.

The First Tee will accept designation as an income beneficiary of Charitable Lead Trusts. The First Tee is not in a position to serve as Trustee.

Planned gifts of any size are a lasting way to help our young people. The First Tee is a division of World Golf Foundation, Inc., a Florida nonprofit corporation, exempt from taxation under Section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

I believe in the power of golf to teach young people important values in addition to a lifelong game. My parents were avid golfers and reinforced in me the Nine Core Values in their day-to-day lives.

Golf changed my life as a kid, and I never stopped playing!
