Responsibilities

- Teach and lead First Tee-sanctioned programs at Mosholu Golf Course and designated locations.
- Instruct community outreach groups both on-site and at partner schools or organizations.
- Communicate with families about program opportunities, as directed by the Program Director.
- Drive retention and progression of current participants.
- Promote and increase participation of Mosholu participants in chapter-wide special events.
- Collaborate with the team to meet program goals.
- Utilize platforms such as Salesforce, Constant Contact, and the First Tee App for daily communications and operations.
- Train and support coaches and volunteers in delivering the First Tee curriculum.
- Maintain active status with the Sport80 training platform.
- Prepare promotional materials, program assessments, and manage equipment and grounds as needed.
- Submit bi-weekly written reports and participate in end-of-session evaluations.
- Lead and support donation initiatives.
- On a project basis in coordination with the Executive Director, manage and support digital marketing initiatives to promote FTMNY storytelling via social media, email, etc.
